

THE F.C.BOGK HOUSE MAY BE REGARDED AS THE BEST OF FRANK LLOYD WRIGHT'S EARLY BUILDINGS IN THE MILWAUKEE AREA. ERECTED IN 1916-17 DURING WHAT IS DESCRIBED AS THE JARANESE YEARS OF WRIGHT'S CAREER, THE STRUCTURE IS EXECUTED IN A TAN TAPESTRY BRICK AND IS TRIMMED WITH PRECAST CONCRETE. SOME OF THE PRECAST CONCRETE, OR "ARTIFICAL STONE" TRIM AS IT WAS REFERRED TO ON THE ORIGINAL WORKING DRAWINGS, FEATURES SIMPLE GEOMETRIC PATTERNS. SIMILAR GEOMETRIC PATTERNS. ARE CARRIED OUT IN THE LEADED GLASS SIDE LIGHTS AND NARROW TRANSOM LIGHTS. THE MASTERY OF LINE AND SIMPLICITY OF MASSING IS CARRIED FORTH INTERNALLY AS WELL AS EXTERMALLY. THE TWO STORY BRICK STRUCTURE IS LOCATED. ON A STANDARD SIZED CITY LOT SURROUNDED BY BUILDINGS OF APPROXIMATELY THE SAME VINTAGE. THE BUILDING HAS BEEN DESIGNATED. A MILWAUKEE LANDMARK.
